Alcohol and drug use among 18-25 year olds has reached epidemic proportions on America's college campuses. Drawing on research and experience gained from working with this population at the Center for the Study of Addiction and Recovery at Texas Tech University, this presentation will focus on understanding the specific needs and challenges of the collegiate addict and will provide information about accessing or creating campus-based recovery support services for students in higher education. There will be a focus on the "family disease of addiction" as well as presentations of case studies. Examples of childrens recovery relative to trust, shame, blame, and family healing will also be discussed in this workshop.
